Only bags identified by 🕰 or 🕰 recycling symbols are accepted. All bags must be clean, dry, and empty. Remove all food residue, paper and receipts, stickers and rigid plastic.

#2 HDPE and #4 LDPE film plastics make up a large portion of the household waste we send to our landfills.

To reduce your use of these plastics, avoid purchasing what cannot be recycled in Brockton:

✓ Bring your own container for bulk or take-out foods

Encourage food producers, manufacturers and retailers to switch to reusable, recyclable or compostable alternatives

How to Recycle Your Film Plastics:

Step 1 Make sure all film plastic is:

<u>Clean</u> - remove all food residue <u>Dry</u> - if you rinse it, let it dry <u>Empty</u> - remove paper, stickers, receipts

Step 2 <u>Tie in a Bag</u> Collect film plastics in an accepted grocery or retail bag and tie tightly. No loose plastics please.

Step 3 Place filled bags in the small round opening in the yellow bin at one of the following locations:
