



South Bruce Youth Bursary

The Municipality of South Bruce in partnership with Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) are again offering South Bruce Youth the opportunity to apply for a \$1,000.00 Bursary.

South Bruce and The Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) continue discussions about building capacity to participate in the Adaptive Phased Management (APM) Project, if it were to come to South Bruce. This includes investments in training and education to equip community members, including youth, to work at the Centre of Expertise, and in subsequent site preparation, construction and operation activities. These investments are intended to include transferable skills that could be applied to other projects or workplaces as well. With this in mind, the South Bruce Community Liaison Committee has approved the implementation of five \$1,000.00 Bursaries to South Bruce Youth who are furthering their education in a post-secondary system with a focus that would fall into one of the Eligible Categories. To maximize the number of youth benefitted through this program, South Bruce youth are only eligible to receive the bursary once.

Eligibility Criteria

The opportunity for this Bursary is available to students in a post secondary program meeting the following criteria:

- South Bruce Resident
- A student attending post-secondary education in one of the following fields:
 - Engineering
 - Environmental
 - Skilled Trades
 - Administration
 - Technical – GIS, IT Etc.
 - Agriculture
 - Health Care/Personal Support
- Has submitted the Completed Application Form no later than September 11, 2020 at 4:30 p.m.
- Is not a prior recipient of the South Bruce Youth Bursary

Application Process

Applicants must complete the “South Bruce Youth Bursary” Form on the reverse side

Information submitted on the form is intended to explain:

- Education/studies that the applicant is currently enrolled in and expected graduation date.
- The applicant’s future career aspirations.
- The applicant will provide an overview of how they have contributed to the community.

Applicants must include a 700 word essay outlining a meaningful way to engage with today’s youth. Include what actions can be taken to encourage youth participation in our community.

Applications will be accepted until **September 11, 2020 at 4:30 p.m.**

Selection Process

The Community Liaison Committee (CLC) will assemble a “Bursary Selection Committee” comprised of two CLC Members, the CAO, Project Manager or the CLC Project Coordinator, and one Nuclear Waste Management Organization Representative.

The Committee will assess all submissions under the approved evaluation criteria. The Successful candidate will be advised of their award by approximately the end of October, 2020. Successful Candidates will be invited to attend a future CLC Meeting to be presented in person with their Bursary Award, if pandemic guidelines permit, and for a photo opportunity. Successful candidates will also appear in media releases including in print and social media.
