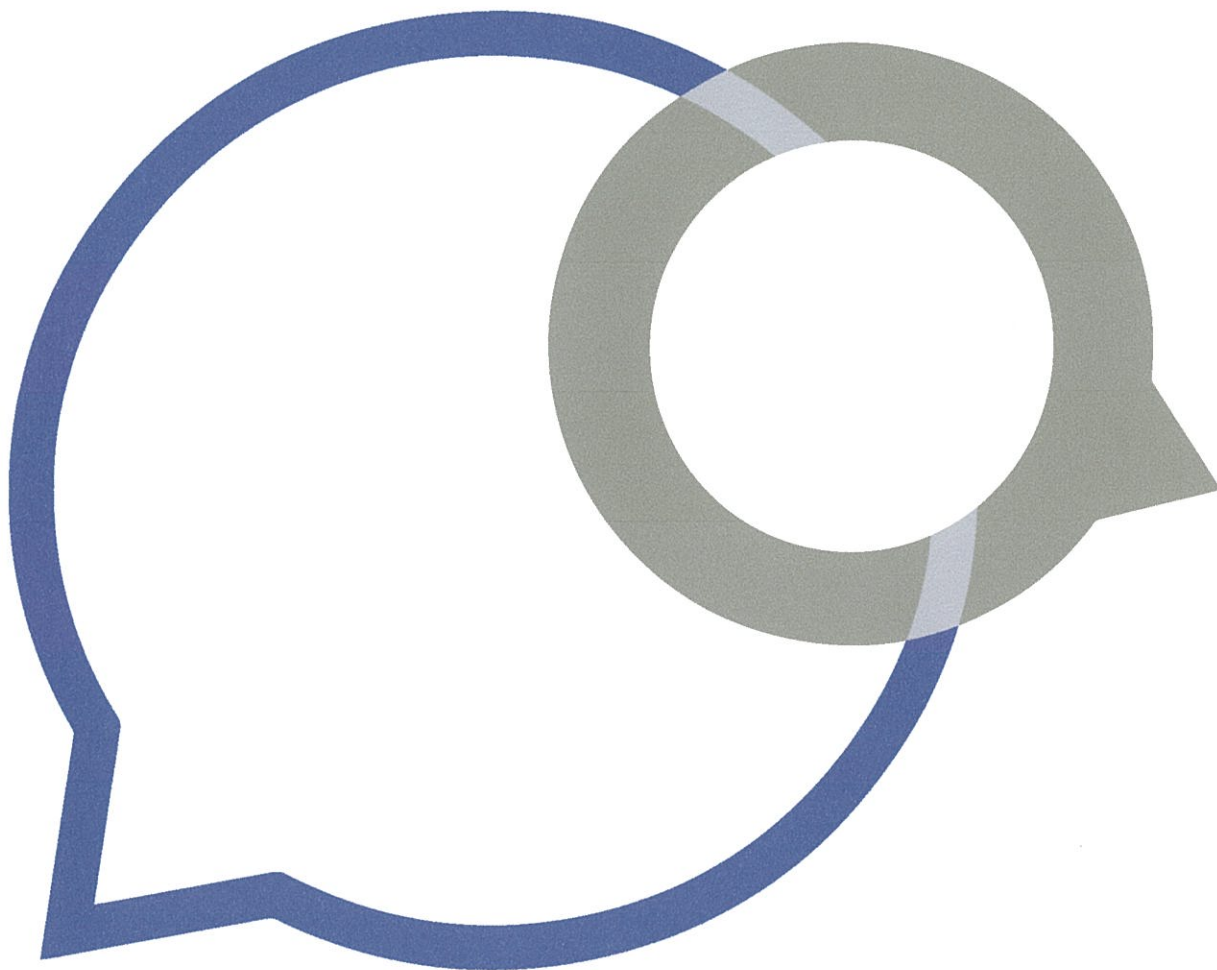

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- **Advisory Committee** | This could involve the existing CLC or a separate committee established specifically for the purposes of making recommendations to Council.
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- **Vote of Council** | The Council of the Municipality of South Bruce would vote on whether the community is willing to host the Project. Council consists of seven members, including Mayor, Deputy Mayor and five Councillors.

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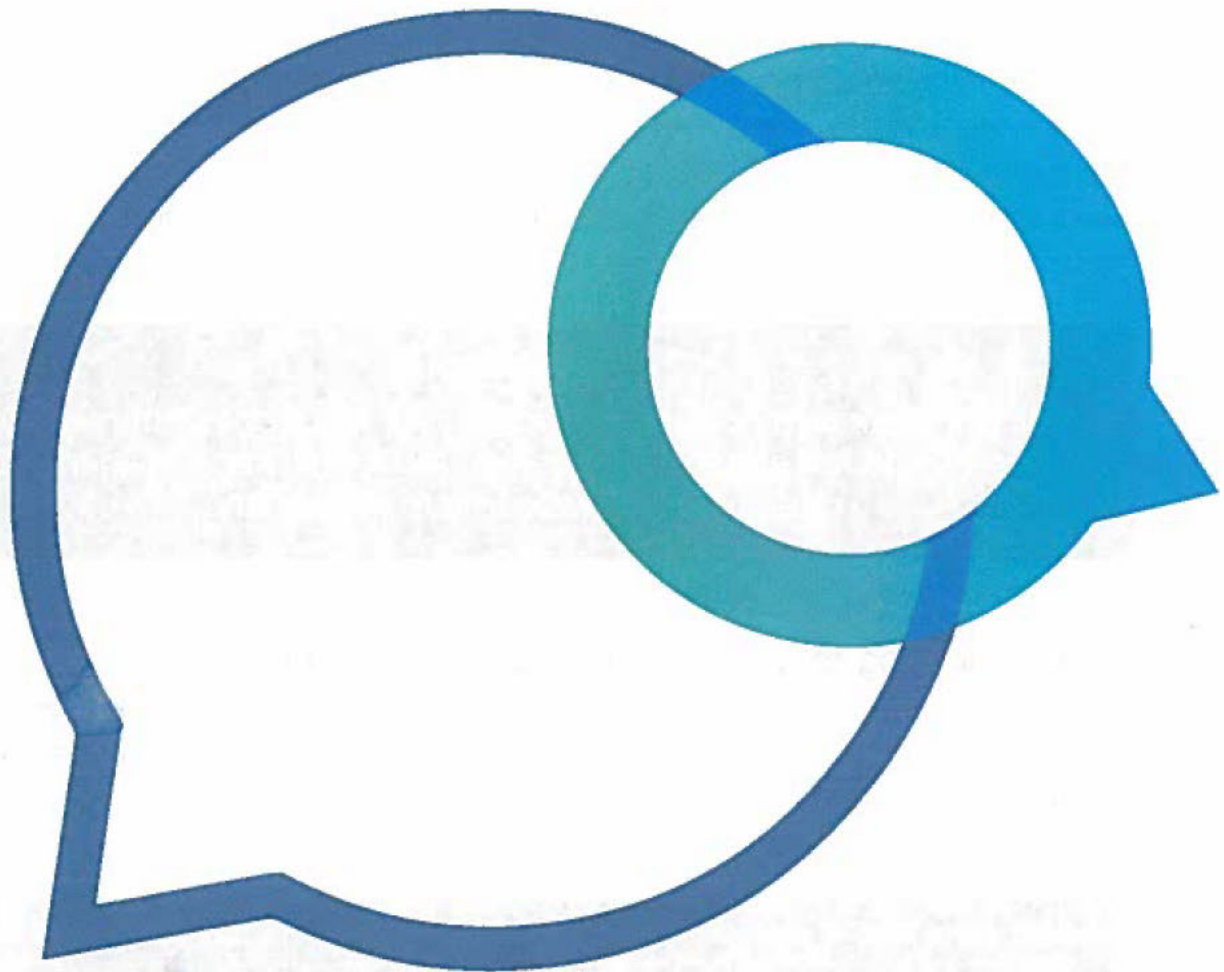
Comments on this workbook and the consultation process:

These willingness questions are like a survey or poll that can be manipulated or skewed to achieve certain desired results. GHD is supposed to conduct an independent process, is hired by the Municipality of South Bruce but paid for by NWMO, seems to be a conflict of interest! It is very difficult to trust in this process.

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This list, presented in alphabetical order, are some examples of the processes that can be used and is not exhaustive. Additional information about the processes listed above is included in Appendix B.

What types of processes do you prefer and why?

I FEEL THAT TOWN HALL MEETINGS BE HELD TO TRUTHFULLY ANSWER QUESTIONS FROM THE COMMUNITY THAT ARE NOT INFLUENCED BY COUNCIL, CLC, & NWMO. WE SHOULD HAVE A LEGAL BINDING REFERENDUM WITH A STRAIGHT FORWARD QUESTION WITH A YES OR NO VOTE.

What types of processes do you dislike and why?

I TRULY DISLIKE THE WAY THE CLC IS SET UP & THE WAY IT HANDLES INQUIRIES OF THE DGR. THEY ARE PRO-DGR & MEMBERS HAVE WRITTEN LETTERS TO EDITOR OF LOCAL PAPER DEMORALIZING RESIDENTS & RATE PAYERS THAT ARE AGAINST THE PROPOSED DGR. THEY PRESENT MAJORITY OF SPEAKERS THAT ARE PRO DGR & APPROVED OF NWMO. I FEEL THEY ARE NOT TRUSTWORTHY. COUNCIL SHOULD REPRESENT RESIDENTS & RATE PAYERS WHO ELECTED THEM AND NOT COURT THE NWMO.

Do you have other suggestions on how willingness could be determined?

WE SHOULD HAVE A PANEL TO ANSWER QUESTIONS THAT ARE INTERESTED IN THE BEST FOR SOUTH BRUCE THAT ARE NOT INFLUENCED & PAID FOR BY NWMO. THEY SHOULD NOT BE FROM COUNCIL, CLC OR NWMO. 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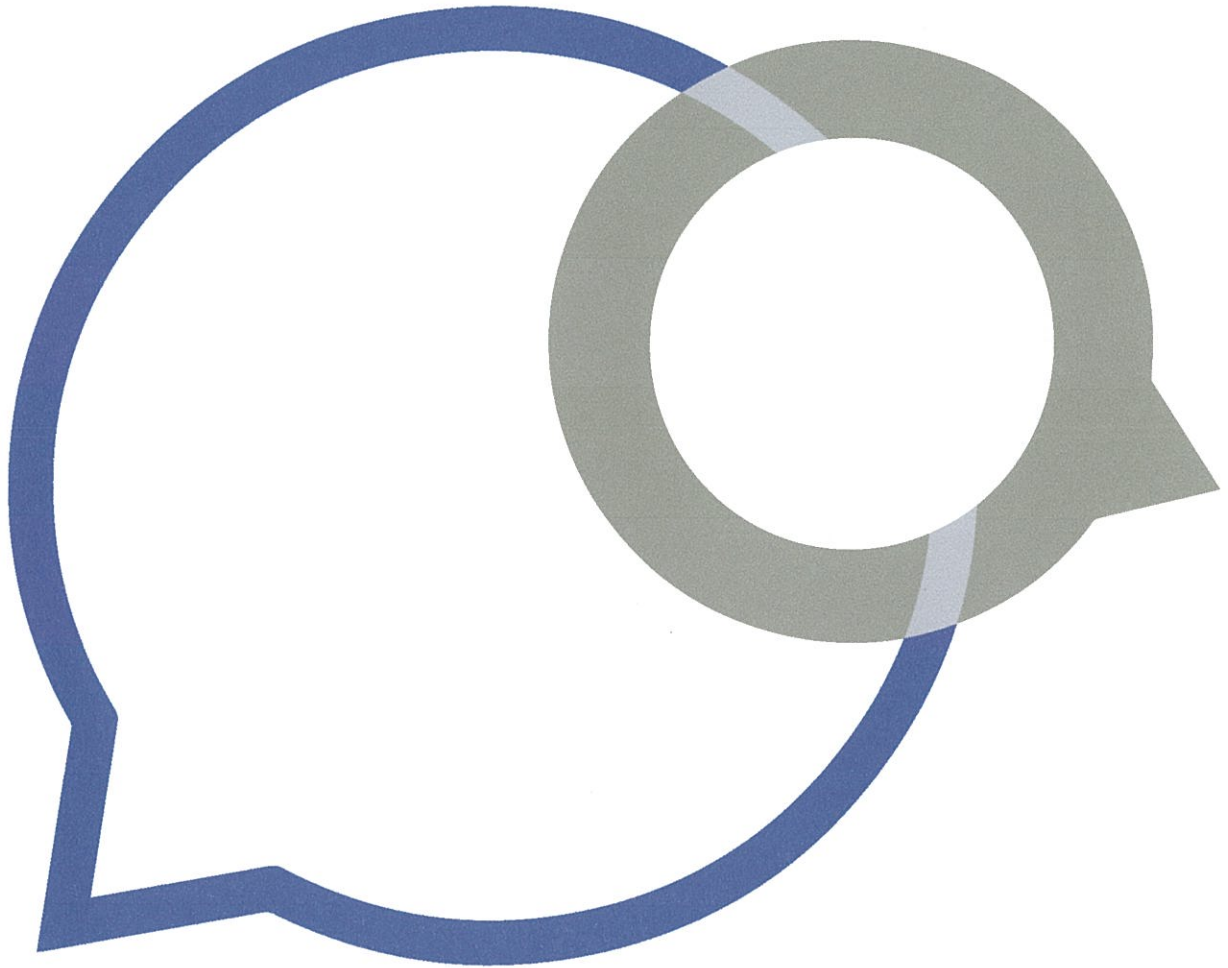
Comments on this workbook and the consultation process:

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Discussion Questions (Continued)

What types of processes do you prefer and why?

Referendum only - it is the only fair, democratic & transparent way to assess willingness from the majority of residents/ratepayers.

- everyone needs to have a voice in this decision, NOT just a few
- no one can decide another person's willingness
- only a referendum gives legitimacy to this process
- this is a massive project affecting the entire community therefore all residents/ratepayers need to and deserve to vote.

What types of processes do you dislike and why?

- ① Advisory Committee (including CLC) - they are not neutral and have not provided a fair & balanced education on this project. Some have shown pro-D&R biases with letters in rural papers. Lack of response to questions & concerns.
- ② Workshops - poorly attended ~~ed~~ & people often intimidated to speak in front of others. Too much NWMO influence & control (over page)

Do you have other suggestions on how willingness could be determined?

Referendum only - this is the only process that cannot be manipulated, stifled & skewed.

Workshops continued

- lack of involvement as can cause hardships in the neighbourhood and even families
- parents worry about alienating their children from friends
- people fear being counted as willing if they attend workshops
- division in community keeps people from voicing opinions
- private vote will stop this.

③ Community Panel - No

- all residents / ratepayers deserve to vote.

④ Opinion Polls & Surveys - No

Questions can be skewed and manipulated to produce a desired result.

⑤ Vote by Council - definitely not. This council has lost trust. They fail to adequately deal with questions and concerns and project the image of wanting to host the D&R for financial gain. Safety of residents, water, the environment and socio economic impacts need to be our first considerations not financial benefits.

This council does not have a mandate to make this decision. No one ran in the last election with "hosting a D&R" as an election issue.

In an interview in the London Free Press in 2016 Mayor Buckle said he would not allow council to make this major decision if he ran again for mayor. He needs to be held to this.

Mayor Buckle also stated on the National News that we were not dependent on NWMO money, ^(this year) so the people need to decide on willingness.

- NWMO stated they would need to store 5.2 million bundles but now say 7.2 million bundles. SMA fuel waste will also come here. It is different than CANDU Fuel waste. How will that be managed?

NWMO has not satisfactorily answered many questions regarding safety, environmental risks, health risks and water protection as well as socio-economic impacts,

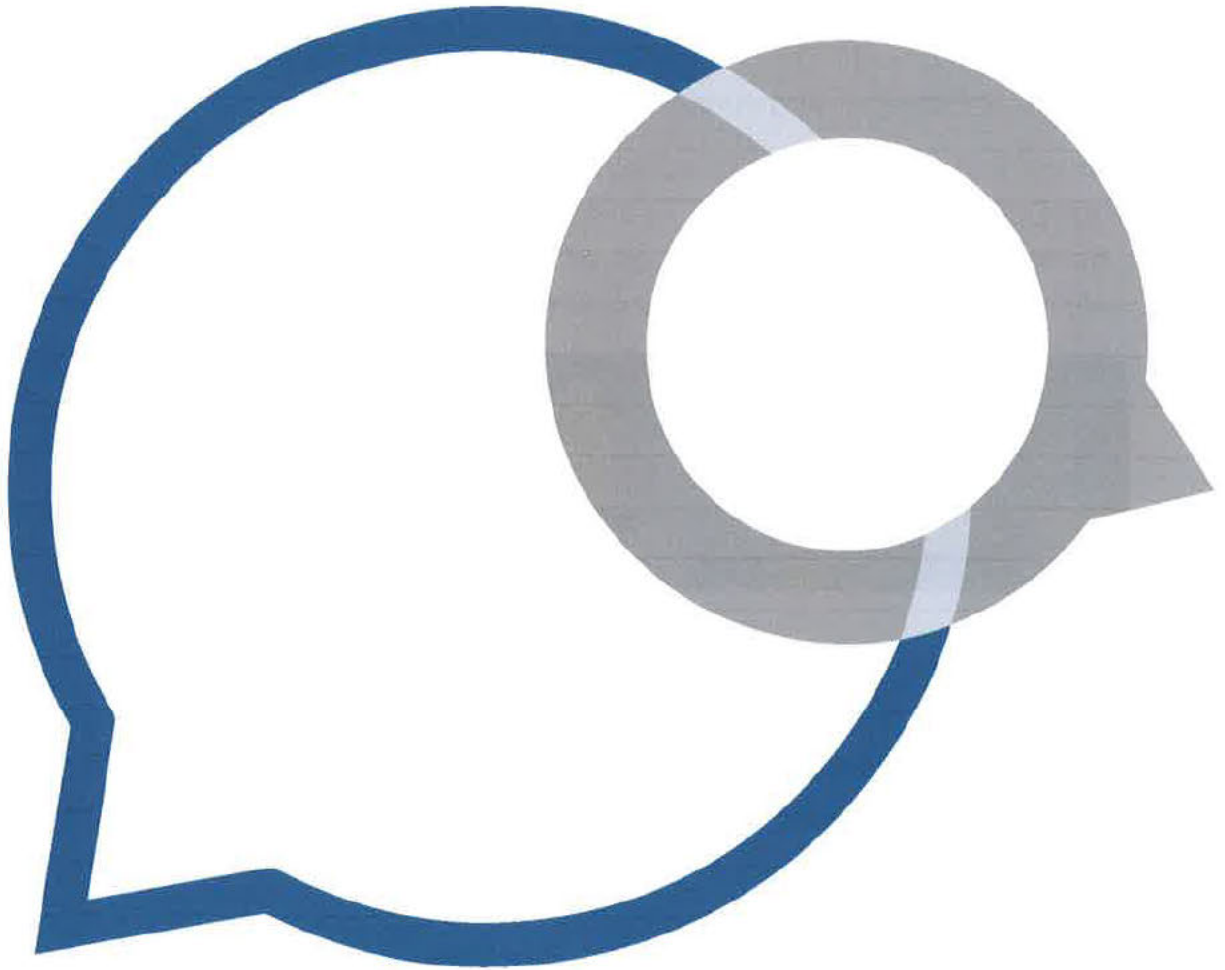

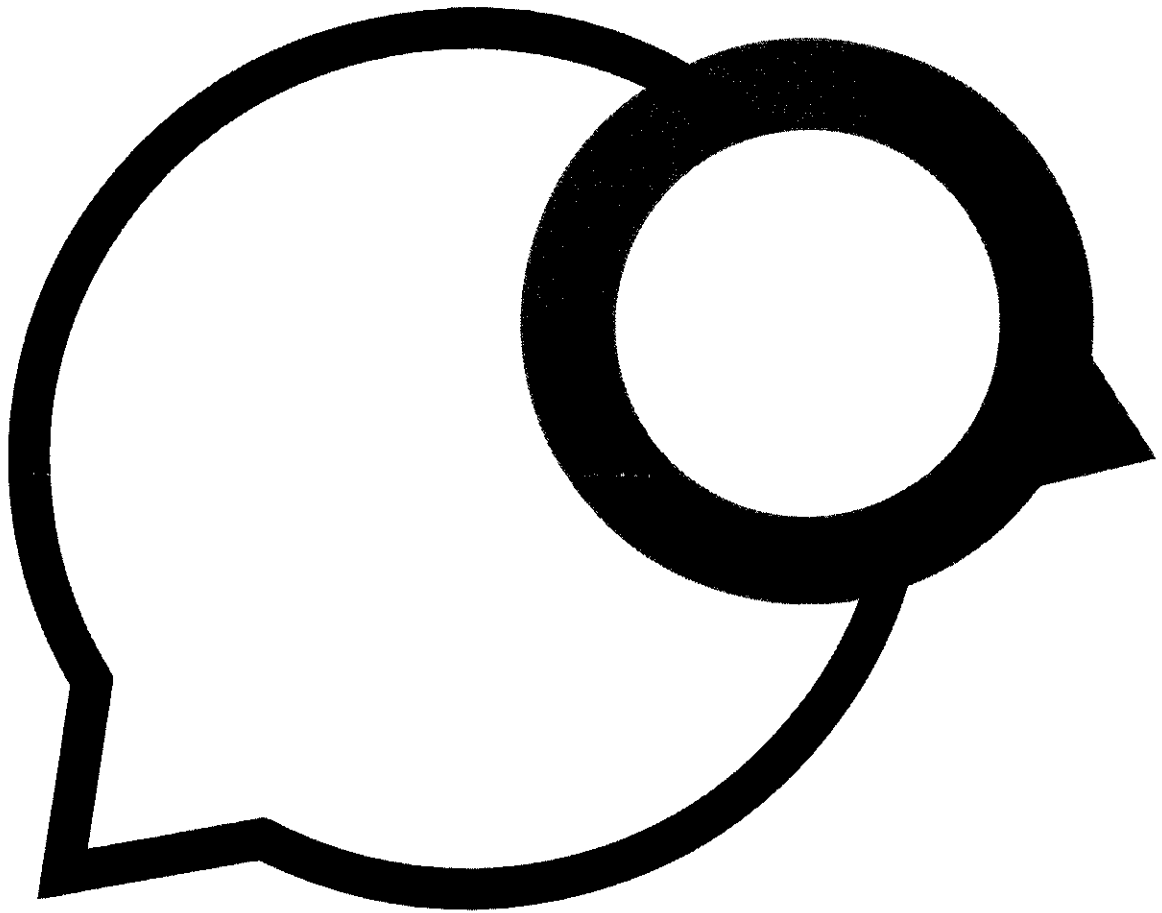

Bruce. The workbook gives **no indication** about what this project "DGR" is and how it is to impact the community of South Bruce. Many do not know just what a "DGR" is, and all that is involved - destroying farmlands, the effect of people's health - physically and mentally, the danger to the environment above and below ground, destroying family livelihoods, etc.. Many don't take an interest. **So how can you determine community willingness?**

This process DID NOT begin more than a decade ago. The NWMO came into many communities promoting their propaganda about a DGR and how they wanted to bury what they call used nuclear bundles, not informing people that it was high level nuclear waste that is 97% radioactive. They have all those scientific theories on how to do it and how it will be safe. But the fact is that they are mandated to find a place to dispose of this "waste" by the federal government, **The NWMO wants a "willing and informed" community but can not tell us what this means, so have put this onto the Municipal Council who now hired GHD under cover of NWMO payments to decide how to do this.**

This emphases for a "willing" community only came in January 2020 when the NWMO announced they had bought/options 1300 acres of farmland. How many know how that came about? If this "deal" was so good, why were communities and land owners not lining up for the "deal"? **The NWMO is bribing the Council and community by giving lots of money to the community which are unrelated to the nuclear industry and a DGR.**

"Community decision making processes should reflect the values and priorities of the community." Really? What are the values and priorities of this community? **Please list them.** Bridges are not fixed, roads are deteriorating, taxes going up, etc. Are these priorities or is a "DGR" a priority? The NWMO claims that hundreds of jobs will come, higher wages, etc. The local working residents will not see this happen, unless you **qualify** to work for the NWMO, and then local business cannot afford to pay the competitive salaries of the NWMO. Long time residents will move out. Long time established lives/livelihoods (generations long) will be destroyed. Is that the values and priorities of a community?

Who randomly picks the committees? Ask anyone who applied and if they indicate they are the least bit anti-nuclear/DGR, they are not picked. And those picked all have some "connection" with the nuclear industry. The CLC only uses NWMO information/references. 1. What process(es) should be used to determine willingness?

The following are some of the community processes that could be used to measure or determine willingness. These can be used alone or in combination. A vote of Council would be part of any community decision-making process.

- **Advisory Committee** | This could involve the existing CLC or a separate committee established specifically for the purposes of making recommendations to Council.
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- **Opinion Polls and Surveys** | Opinion polls and surveys can be used to obtain opinions from a sample of people, usually with the intention of generalizing the results to a larger population. Respondents are typically identified at random and surveys can be conducted by telephone, mail or in-person.
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- **Vote of Council** | The Council of the Municipality of South Bruce would vote on whether the community is willing to host the Project. Council consists of seven members, including Mayor, Deputy Mayor and five Councillors.

This list, presented in alphabetical order, are some examples of the processes that can be used and is not exhaustive. Additional information about the processes listed above is included in Appendix B.

For a referendum to be binding, at least 50% of eligible municipal voters must cast a vote on the question, and more than 50% of those votes must be in favour of the decision.
